Vatican Document on Anglican Patrimony

Earlier this month, Bishop Lopes met with Pope Leo XIV during the plenary meeting of the Bishops of the Personal Ordinariates established under the Apostolic Constitution Anglicanorum coetibus. The bishops also met with the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith. As a result of that meeting, Bishop Lopes stated in a message this week, "The Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, in consultation with the three Ordinariate bishops, has prepared a reflection on our unique English patrimony. For those of us in the Ordinariate, it is an exhortation to live this patrimony in all of its richness. We have been given a unique set of tools (the way we worship, the way we structure parish life, the centrality of family life, etc.) which add to the vitality of the Catholic Church. Our Ordinariate identity arises from fidelity to this patrimony and this mission. Our diversity does not detract from the underlying communion of the Church...it strengthens it." The document, "Anglican Heritage as Lived in the Ordinariates," is available via the QR code and is also linked on the FlockNote email sent yesterday, along with an article about the document from Our Sunday Visitor.

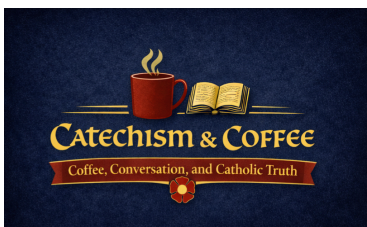
Easter Sunday (April 5)

The Ordinariate is undertaking a Lenten campaign of Christian charity to support the Benedictine Sisters of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the only religious Order properly established within the Ordinariate itself (erected within the Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham in the UK). The Sisters have outgrown their rented facilities, meaning they cannot accept new vocations or women discerning. Landlord restrictions have made it very difficult to create the monastic rhythm of daily prayer and work; if they cannot work, they cannot earn the funds necessary to support their life.
